

Where is Grosvenor Hall?



What is Residential/school journey?

- A three day (2 night) trip to Kent.
- School journey is from Monday 20th May to Wednesday 23rd May.
- Children will be looked after by teachers that they know and trained staff from the centre.

Where will we sleep?


- Rooms range from 2–10 children
- Boys and girls will sleep in separate rooms
- Children will be asked who they would like to share a room with
- There will be adults from school around and members of staff from the site on patrol each night.
- Showering facilities are at the end of each corridor
- Children can bring a snack for their rooms

Meal times

- All meals are included in the cost of school journey.
- Kingswood provides three hot meals a day.
- There is always a choice of dishes.
- Salad, breads and drinks are always available.
- All dietary requirements are catered for
- Hot chocolate is served in the evening

Activities available at Kingswood include:

- Abseiling, Archery, Ball Sports, Challenge Course, Climbing, Giant Swing, Initiative Exercises, Jacob's Ladder, Sensory Trail, Trapeze, Zip Wire, fencing, go karts.
- Evening activities led by qualified Kingswood staff including a disco on the last night.







Travel

- Children need to arrive at school normal time.
- They will need to bring their luggage (cabin sized only) and will have lunch at school before they leave.
- We will be leaving Hazelbury around 11:30 travelling on a coach and taking one minibus.
- On Friday they can be collected from school at 3:30

What to pack

- A full kit list will be provided in plenty of time prior to the trip.
- Bedding is provided.
- Leave valuable items at home
- No electronics or phones – parents will be given an emergency number to call should they need it.
- All medicine should be handed in to staff to administer
- Your child has to be able to carry their own bag – one small suitcase only.
- If children wish to bring spending money for snacks/souvenirs, we recommend this is kept to a maximum of £5 – Bring change

What do I need to do now?

- Parents will be able to pay the deposit for the trip on Arbor. The deposit is £30 and is due by the end of October.
- The total cost is £217, so once the deposit is paid you have £187 to pay as and when you wish until the end of April (this works out just over £30 a month from Nov-Apr).
- The deposit is non-refundable as we have to pay this to the centre to reserve the spaces.
